Attendees enjoy a variety of ABHMShosted events at Biennial Mission Summit







Biennial Mission Summit attendees enjoyed a variety of American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS)-hosted events including worship, a luncheon and two Biennial Academy offerings—in Virginia Beach in June.

During worship, close to \$5,000 was collected for ABHMS' ongoing "Rebuilding, Restoring, Renewing Puerto Rico" initiative.

During the luncheon, the Rev. Anne J. Scalfaro, senior pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, presented about her church's New Baptist Covenant-based racial reconciliation partnership with New Hope Baptist Church, both in Denver, while Sheena D. Rolle, community organizer and founder of FHJ Strategies Inc., discussed faith as belief in things yet unseen.

ABHMS Executive Director Dr. Jeffrey Haggray announced the formal launch of ministrElife, the ABHMS-created online networking platform that had been in the user testing phase since November 2018.

The ABHMS-sponsored Biennial Academy offerings were "Jesus Was An Inmate: A Movement to End Mass Incarceration"—presented by the Rev. Dr. Raphael G. Warnock, senior pastor of the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church, Atlanta—and "Whole, Healthy, Hopeful Children in Every Community," presented by the Rev. Dr. Marilyn P. Turner-Triplett, ABHMS director, Healing and Transforming Communities.

Warnock was joined by the Rev. Billy Honor Jr., faith coordinator at The New Georgia Project, and attorney Tiffany Williams Roberts, Community Engagement & Movement Building Counsel, Southern Center for Human Rights. Turner-Triplett was joined by the executive directors of three ABHMS partnering organizations: the Rev. Carmen Porco, Housing Ministries of American Baptists in Wisconsin; Jennifer Muniga, Cameron Community Ministries, Rochester, N.Y.; and Jermaine Alberty, Pathways to Promise, St. Louis, Mo.



ABHMS Rizpah's Children partner to establish CDF Freedom School this summer

Somerset Academy Early Learning Center, Philadelphia a partner of ABHMS' Rizpah's Children ministry—is establishing a six-week Children's Defense Fund (CDF) Freedom School this summer. The school is funded, in part, by a grant from the Virginia and Gordon Palmer Jr. Trust, administered by American Baptist Foundation and awarded during ABHMS' 2018 grant cycle.

CDF is a national nonprofit organization that advocates for programs that aid children. Located in 87 U.S. cities in 28 states, CDF Freedom Schools offer summer literacy and cultural enrichment at no cost to families of children and youth in kindergarten through grade 12.

The Somerset Academy CDF Freedom School will serve kindergarten through second grade students who may not otherwise have access to books, learning opportunities or nutri-



tious food. Using an integrated reading curriculum, it seeks to reduce summer learning loss and prepare students to enter the school year at or above the reading level of their peers. It will be held July 8-Aug.16.

Since 2014, Somerset Academy has been serving the most vulnerable children and families in North Central Philadelphia.

ABHMS seeks to make a difference in the lives of children living in poverty by engaging its mission partners to help establish additional Freedom Schools throughout the United States and Puerto Rico.
