The Rev. Dr. Luz Celeniar ("Lucy") Tirado is a chaplain for Valley Home Care Hospice and the Protestant chaplain in the women's facility of New York City Corrections. She is a

board certified chaplain with the Association of Professional Chaplains. A native New Yorker, her family of origin is from Puerto Rico. She has worked and trained in several different hospitals, nursing homes and hospices throughout New Jersey, New York, Massachusetts and Connecticut.



Christian Esteban is executive director of JOYA Scholars, a nonprofit in Fullerton, southern California, that serves junior high and high school students who dream

of becoming first-generation college students. Esteban believes that mentorship is the key to serving JOYA Scholars' Latinx and immigrant neighbors and that higher education has the power to break the cycle of poverty.



The Rev. Ashlee Wiest-**Laird** has been pastor at First Baptist Church, Jamaica Plain, Mass., since 2003. She began with a mandate to redevelop the congregation and, after

a devastating fire, has overseen a building project as well. During her tenure, the church has trained more than 20 seminarians, started "The Centre for Faith, Art & Justice" and grown in membership and capacity to serve both God and neighbor, while coordinating significant out reach through the COVID pandemic.



Dr. Reggies Wenyika is president and professor of Education and Religion at Ottawa University Midwest, an American Baptist-related and global college in Ottawa,

Kansas, with students from 39 states and 33 countries. He has a strong commitment to training people, and his leadership is marked by a strong dedication to God and the students of Ottawa University.

ABHMS announces the names of six individuals chosen to participate in the second cohort of its "Co-Creators Incubator."

The Co-Creators Incubator is a two-year program that strives to nurture the growth of innovative ministry ideas.



While fostering collegiality, the incubator provides creative individuals—referred to as *Co-Creators*—with resources to develop their ideas or enhance their ministries, pairing them with mentors and introducing them to creative partners who may provide long-term financial and other support.

While a Co-Creator is eager to put ideas into action, he or she may be at any point in the creative process, from brainstorming to launching.


The new Co-Creators and their projects are as follows: Monique C. Harrington, Way Club, a faith-based social club for high school-aged teenagers; **Dr. Ruth Alerte Jones**, the H.E.M. (Healing Embrace Maternal) Network, a faith-based ministry centered on spiritual wellness for women following pregnancy loss; Jonathan Malone, multiple-day hiking and backpacking trips into the wilderness, with an emphasis on engaging with the divine; the Rev. Yolanda M. Norton, Global Arts and Theology Experience (GATE), an organization dedicated to promoting the wholeness, healing and development of Black girls and women through programs that promote womanist theology and the arts; Dria Price, Justevia, which creates natural tea blends using locally grown, organic herbs that are sweetened with stevia as opposed to sugar; and Alex Zarecki, songwriting that is fit for personal and congregational enjoyment.

Book: Ministry transitions can be times of renewal

Designed as a practical and deeply spiritual guide for congregations facing pastoral transition, Judson Press' "Transformed by Pastoral Transition: A Guide for Congregations" uses the framework of the Christian worship service to help church leaders usher their faith community through a process of honoring the past, healing the present and discerning the future.

The book includes worship resources for each stage in the transitional season, from bidding farewell and processing grief related to the outgoing minister to



celebrating the gifts of community and anticipating the next stage in the congregation's life together.

"Transformed by Pastoral Transition" asserts that transitions in ministry are opportunities for renewal and growth. It addresses the experience and needs of the transitioning congregation, so that it might

be a season of transformation in the life of the church. It defines a process for navigating pastoral transition that can be tailored to individual congregational contexts.

The book is written by the Rev. Dr. Marcia B. Bailey, an American Baptist pastor and an associate professor of teaching at Temple University, Philadelphia.
