


### Neighborhood Center Reaching Teens, Transforming Community

Cameron Community Ministries is a 34-year-old urban outreach center in Rochester, N.Y.'s Lyell-Otis Neighborhood, where violent crime is 6.5 times higher than in the suburbs. The school district's graduation rate is 47 percent. Fifty-one percent of Rochester's children live in poverty.

By embarking on a campaign to transform an abandoned, foreclosed rental property into a teen center, Cameron Community Ministries is not only meeting a



critical need by creating a safe space for youth but also helping to heal the community, one property at a time.

The foreclosed property had become a dumping ground and hub for crime. Such properties can have a ripple effect.

However, while deterioration is contagious, revitalization is contagious, too. People take more pride in their own property when other properties in the neighborhood are rehabilitated.





### Making a Difference in the Lives of Children Affected by Poverty

Thirty million U.S. children live in low income-, poverty- or deep poverty-level family homes; 5 million of these children are infants and toddlers. Seven out of 10 low-income children belong to working poor families, in which at least one working caregiver labors at a job that offers little security and low wages.

Because of the conditions associated with such jobs, caregivers are likely to be absent on weekends and evenings. Therefore, no adult may be available to provide



homework assistance, cook healthy meals, offer life guidance, play, talk or pray with these children. Because they are growing up at a time when

the poor are often denigrated, it can be impossible for them to maintain a positive self-image, sense of dignity or hope.

Contrary to stereotypes, poverty affects children of all colors. More than onethird of the children living in poverty are white or Asian. However, even in 2019, ethnicity and skin color play significant roles. Children of color—Black, Hispanic and Native American—are nearly three times as likely to live in poor families as their white peers.




