AAABC, Asian Baptist leaders consult with ABHMS



ABHMS hosted an Alliance of Asian American Baptist Churches (AAABC) meeting and welcomed Asian Baptist leaders for a consultation in March.

The AAABC had been known as the Asian American Baptist Caucus since its founding in 1971. The new name was adopted at American Baptist Churches USA's 2011 Biennial Mission Summit. ABHMS leadership was invited to the AAABC meeting to discuss

ways in which the two organizations could partner.

Later, Asian Baptist leaders consulted with the Rev. Salvador Orellana, ABHMS director of Intercultural Ministries, and the Rev. Florence Li, ABHMS national coordinator of Asian Ministries, to identify Asian churches' needs.

The next day, key moments of Asian Ministries were reviewed, and the group received training in ministrElife, ABHMS' new online networking platform. The names of at least 40 millennials were offered as potential emerging leaders.

Diverse partners 'Converge' at ABHMS event

In April, ABHMS held "Converge," an event that convened partners from three of the organization's affinity groups:

- the first cohort of the Co-Creators Incubator, a program that helps faith-based entrepreneurs nurture their ideas into viable ministries;
- presidents and designated representatives of American Baptist-related Colleges and Universities; and
- recipients of grants from the Virginia and Gordon Palmer Jr. Trust awarded during ABHMS' 2018 cycle.

The intent was to share learnings, while exploring ways in which collaboration can exponentially increase the impact of mission outreach.

"The face, form and expression of mission has changed dramatically," ABHMS Executive Director Dr. Jeffrey Haggray



said. "For several generations, ABHMS commissioned missionaries. Nowadays, we are partnering with a whole new generation of folks who are meeting God's mission in new ways."

Keynote speaker the Rev. John L. McCullough,

president and CEO of ABHMS partner Church World Service, discussed the prevalence of global migration, including the plight of those who migrate because of poverty, violence, war, injustice and climate change. He said that one of eight faith-based shelters along the U.S. Southern border has alone welcomed 50,000 migrants since October.

"I want you to hear that perhaps inherent in that number—50,000 people—is a new opportunity to define what it means to be church," he stressed.


For a "Sharing Our Learnings" session, members of the diverse entities conversed in groups of three. "There's something energizing in talking to other grant recipients," said Andrea Gallegos of First Baptist Church, La Jolla, Calif., which received a grant for its "Surf Church" ministry. "We're doing such vastly different things, yet we're all in it together."
