

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ABHMS awards more than \$3 million in 2020 grants


In a report to the board of directors at its virtual meeting June 7-8, the Rev. Rothangliani Chhangte, senior associate for Strategic Initiatives and Relationships, said that ABHMS distributed more than \$3 million in grants last year.

Included in that total is \$637,577 earmarked for disaster recovery and more than \$1 million in program grants distributed to Community Outreach Ministries, Rizpah's Children partners, Intercultural Ministries partners and financial aid scholarships, among others. Additionally, \$317,226 was awarded to 108 American Baptist-related partners and organizations for COVID-19 relief May 2020–May 2021. Most COVID-19 relief ministries funded hunger initiatives; the majority of recipients were children and the elderly.

"We see grant-making as an extension of mission and ministry," said Dr. Jeffrey Haggray, ABHMS executive director, "as we seek to develop in-depth relationships with ministries that receive support."
